**DUI Saturation Patrol:**

The Delano Police Department Traffic Unit conducted a DUI Saturation Patrol on Friday, November 15, 2019. The detail operated between the hours of 1900 hours through 0300 hours. Five sworn and non-sworn personnel participated in this detail. Over fifty (50) traffic enforcement stops were conducted and eight (8) motorists were issued citations for operating a vehicle without a license or on a suspended/revoked license. No arrest or significant occurrences occurred during this DUI Saturation Patrol.
